<b>Title III-E Service</b>	<b>Description</b>	<b>Unit</b>
<p>Assistance: Information and Assistance (Caregiver)</p> <p>*NEW SERVICE*</p>	<p>A service that provides the individuals with current information on opportunities and services available to the individuals within their communities, including information relating to assistive technology;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• assesses the problems and capacities of the individuals;</li> <li>• links the individuals to the opportunities and services that are available;</li> <li>• to the maximum extent practicable, ensures that the individuals receive the services needed by the individuals, and are aware of the opportunities available to the individuals, by establishing adequate follow-up procedures; and</li> <li>• serves the entire community of older individuals, particularly—               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ caregivers who are older individuals with greatest social need;</li> <li>○ older individuals with greatest economic need;</li> <li>○ older relative caregivers of children with severe disabilities, or individuals with disabilities who have severe disabilities;</li> <li>○ family caregivers who provide care for individuals with Alzheimer’s disease and related disorders with neurological and organic brain dysfunction; and</li> <li>○ caregivers of “frail” individuals defined as: unable to perform at least two activities of daily living without substantial human assistance, including verbal reminding, physical cueing, or supervision; and/or cognitive or other mental impairment, requires substantial supervision because the individual behaves in a manner that poses a serious health or safety hazard to the individual or to another individual.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>(Source: OAA)</p>	<p>Per contact</p>

<p><b>Respite (in-home)</b></p> <p><b>*NEW*</b></p>	<p>A respite service provided in the home of the caregiver or care receiver and allows the caregiver time away to do other activities. During such respite, other activities can occur which may offer additional support to either the caregiver or care receiver, including homemaker or personal care services. (Source: ACT committee)</p>	<p>Hours (partial hour may be reported to two decimal places, e.g. 0.25 hours.)</p>
<p><b>Respite (out-of-home, day)</b></p> <p><b>*NEW*</b></p>	<p>A respite service provided in settings other than the caregiver/care receiver's home, including adult day care, senior center or other non-residential setting (in the case of older relatives raising children, day camps), where an overnight stay does not occur that allows the caregiver time away to do other activities. (Source: ACT committee)</p>	<p>Hours (partial hour may be reported to two decimal places, e.g. 0.25 hours.)</p>
<p><b>Supplemental Services (Caregiver)</b></p>	<p>Goods and services provided on a limited basis to complement the care provided by caregivers. (Source: OAA)</p>	<p>N/A</p>
<p><b>Support Groups (Caregiver)</b></p> <p><b>*NEW*</b></p>	<p>A service that is led by a trained individual, moderator, or professional, as required by state policy, to facilitate caregivers to discuss their common experiences and concerns and develop a mutual support system. Support groups are typically held on a regularly scheduled basis and may be conducted in person, over the telephone, or online. For the purposes of Title III-E funding, caregiver support groups would not include "caregiver education groups," "peer-to-peer support groups," or other groups primarily aimed at teaching skills or meeting on an informal basis without a facilitator that possesses training and/or credentials as required by state policy. **Required caregiver information to be submitted:**

- Caregiver Age
- Caregiver Gender

- Caregiver Rural
- Caregiver Poverty (with Income Below Poverty)
- Caregiver Live Alone
- Caregiver Race (White (Alone), White (Alone) – Hispanic, American Indian or Alaska Native (Alone), Asian (Alone), Black or African American (Alone), Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander (Alone), Persons Reporting Some Other Race, Persons Reporting 2 or More Races)
- Caregiver Ethnicity (Hispanic or Latino, Not Hispanic or Latino)
- Caregiver Relationship to Care Recipient (Husband, Wife, Son/Son-in-Law, Daughter/Daughter-in-Law, Other Relative, Non-Relative)
- For Grandparents and Other Elderly Caregivers Serving Children:
  - o Number of children 18 or younger receiving care by caregiver
  - o Total persons with disabilities 19-59 receiving care by caregiver
